Deborah Zelinsky, O.D. - *Mind-Eye Institute* The Critical Role of a Mind-Eye Connection in the Legally Blind Population

Most people think of legal blindness as a condition where eyesight is not clear, or some of the visual field is missing. This presentation explains (in simple terms) how eyesight is only one of many visual skills. It is a visual skill dealing with external information. Even if eyesight is not "normal", there are many other learnable visual skills to help legally blind people make sense out of the surroundings. A couple of take-home games will be demonstrated for people to develop their internal visualization abilities and judgments of space.

11:30 AM Philip Troyk, Ph.D. – IL Institute of Technology The Intracortical Visual Prosthesis (ICVP) – Communicating Image Information to the Brain

For the past 20 years, Illinois Tech has led a multiinstitutional team for the development of the Intracortical Visual Prosthesis (ICVP), which is designed to communicate image information directly to the brain, bypassing the eyes and optic nerves. An 8-institution team, funded by the NIH BRAIN Initiative, has brought the technology to a current clinical trial for the purpose of determining how people with severe visual impairment might be able to use this artificial vision as a visual aid. The project began in 1970 at the NIH and has seen a long history of technological development coupled with enhanced understandings about how and why people with blindness might benefit from the ICVP system. This presentation will describe the technology and report on our unique work to understand experiences and motivations of potential clinical trial participants, as well as those of others who have experienced earlier brain-based visual prosthesis systems.

The proper tools, mindset, and support can transform hopelessness into hopepain into growth- and challenges into strength. Our life experiences of pain and suffering do not have to occur in vain but can serve as opportunities for purpose and resilience. Yes! Come what may, we can find calm in the storm.

Deborah Zelinsky, O.D. - *Mind-Eye Institute* Deborah Zelinsky, O.D. is an optometrist noted worldwide for her discovery of the use of eyeglasses to alter sound location, and her subsequent development of the Z-BellSM Test. This patented test allows Dr.

Zelinsky and her team to prescribe lenses that synchronize the integration between auditory and visual sensory inputs. Dr. Zelinsky's background includes a rotation at the Society for the Blind in Minneapolis, and the Directorship of a Low Vision Clinic in Florida. Currently, she serves as founder and executive research director of The Mind-Eye Institute in Northbrook. She wants to "Leave 20/20 in the 20th Century" by enhancing eye testing to include more assessments of moving targets and overall awareness of surroundings. The measurement of 20/20 eyesight does not consider the periphery or sensory integration, both of which are critical in the legally blind population. In addition to her work with the Mind-Eye Institute, Dr. Zelinsky is a board member of the Society for Brain Mapping and a community leader for the Society of Neuroscience. Philip Troyk, Ph.D. – IL Institute of Technology

Dr. Troyk is a Professor in the Department of Biomedical Engineering, the Executive Director of the Pritzker Institute of Biomedical Science and Engineering, and an affliated Professor in the Stuart

School of Business at IIT. His research interests are broad and include cortical and retinal visual prostheses, implantable EMG sensors (IMES), functional electrical stimulation systems, design of neural prostheses, bioelectronic medicine, smart sensors, Radio Frequency Identification, telemetry, VLSI design, and packaging of implantable electronic devices. He is also President/CEO of Sigenics, Inc, a Chicago-based company that designs customized electronics for medical and industrial uses. He is the leader of the eight-institution ICVP team to develop an intracortical visual prosthesis. He obtained his BS in Electrical Engineering from the University of Illinois, Urbana, and an MS and Ph.D. in Bioengineering from the University of Illinois, Chicago.



Dennis Newport – Tai Chi Instructor

Dennis Newport has been a Tai Chi practicioner for more than a decade, studying three major forms -- Yang, Chen, and Wu. He is currently studying Wu forms as well as Qigong and Taoist meditation with Chris Cinnamon at Chicago Tai Chi and is certified by Allison Deputy of

Dennis can be found teaching at many locations throughout the Chicago area, but BSA is quite fortunate to have him on Tuesday mornings for our very unique audio only class. Dennis is wonderful with audio instruction and connecting with participants via phone conference. Every class starts and continues with appreciation of the breathe and gentle movements which leave you relaxed and with a renewed sense of well being.



James Boehm, M.Ed, LPC-MHSP – Alliance Counseling James Boehm describes himself as a passionate leader and an advocate who values collaboration and empowering others to their fullest potential. His specialties within counseling include, but are not limited to, adjustment to disability, depression, anxiety, chronic

pain, suicidal ideation, and addiction. Through an integrated approach of mind and body, Boehm engages with clients to apply strategies and develop personalized goals that help them to move forward. James completed his master's degree in May 2019 from Peabody College of Vanderbilt University in Clinical Mental Health Counseling. He is working towards his LPC in the mental health counseling field at The Refuge Center and Alliance Counseling, his own practice in Maryland Farms. Boehm feels that with the proper tools, education, and supports, all individuals can live the life that they were created for and believes strongly in advocacy and equality for all individuals, including people with disabilities. James serves on the Nashville Mayor's Advisory Committee for People with Disabilities, as the President of the Nashville Chapter and the state VP of the National Federation of the Blind, and as Founder and President of the 501(c)(3) nonprofit You Cane Give with his wife, Wendy Boehm. He also founded and served on the TN Association of Guide Dog Users (he has an amazing guide dog named Bogey) and has been a mentor to college students with Learning Ally.



Parres Wright, O.D., FAAO – *Midwestern University* Dr. Wright is a honors graduate of Tennessee State University. She is also a graduate with professional distinction from Nova Southeastern University's College of Optometry. Dr. Wright completed her residency training in Low Vision Rehabilitation and Geriatric Optometry at the VA Medical Center in Birmingham, Alabama. During her residency, she was selected as one of five optometry residents in the nation to be a presenter in the Southeastern Educational Congress of Optometry (SECO) series "High Hurdles: The Most Challenging Resident Cases of the Year." Following residency training, Dr. Wright headed an Advanced Low Vision Clinic at the VA Medical Center in Nashville, Tennessee. Dr. Wright is a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry. Her passion is working with visually impaired and geriatric populations.
